Remember those that are plugged in whether you're there or not, the price is \$2.00 per day excluding the weekend days of an event that you were charged for. I know for a fact that it is cheaper here than at home. This allows us to keep refrigerated food when we are enjoying the club every weekend.

THE GRAND VALLEY CAP N BALLERS AND MICHIGAN STATE CAMPING RULES

- 1. Each camper must keep his own campsite clean, neat and the grass cut.
- 2. There will be only one fixed fire pit on each campsite.
- 3. Use only existing cut wood or use dead fallen trees. No standing trees may be cut.
- 4. When the camping unit is not in use, it must be disconnected from utilities (electric and water) OR PAY THE \$2.00 ELECTRICAL FEE PER DAY. ANY GUEST CAMPING WITH THEIR UNIT IS REQUIRED TO PAY \$5.00/DAY FOR ELECTRICAL USE.
- 5. Additional electrical use, after the 20 days included in the annual fee, is to be paid for at the monthly meeting to Ron at shot gun and Jackie on the main campground

#### **GVCnB 2026 MEMBERSHIP AND CAMPSITE RENEWAL FEE**

Annual dues and campsite fees are payable no later than January 31, 2026. Payment must be made to treasurer FOR \$150.00 FOR THE CAMP SITE AND \$50.00 MEMBERSHIP DUES either at any meeting or postmarked no later than January 31, 2026. Make checks payable to Grand Valley Cap N Ballers. Fill out ahead of time to avoid confusion. Thanks. This form must be completed with payment.

IF YOUR CHECK IS NOT POSTMARKED BY JANUARY 31, YOU WILL LOSE YOUR MEMBERSHIP AND NEED TO START OVER AGAIN TO BECOME A MEMBER.

If you have a designated campsite and the fee is not paid ahead of time, FEE WILL BE DOUBLED AFTER JANUARY 31, 2026. If not paid within 30 days after January 31, the unit must be moved off club property, or it will be impounded by local law enforcement.

REMEMBER THAT ALL MEMBERS WHO HAVE CAMPING UNITS ON CLUB PROPERTY ARE EXPECTED TO CARRY INSURANCE ON THEIR UNITS OR ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE THAT MAY OCCUR WHILE ON CLUB PROPERTY.



- All paper targets must be shot and turned in to be scored. Targets not turned in are subject to point deduction penalty.




